Running a Business Out of Your Home

The City of Charlotte has rules about running a business out of your home. Be sure to check the full details at www.charlotteplanning.org. Below are some specifics that you should know.

 The home occupation must be clearly incidental to the residential use of the dwelling and must not change the essential residential character of the dwelling

 Machinery that causes noise, electrical interference with radio or television reception, vibration, glare, fumes, odors, dust, detectable at the property line is prohibited.

 No equipment and materials/ supplies that are not normally a part of domestic or household equipment may be used

or stored on the property. Medical, dental, and office equipment used for professional purposes may be used. A single trailer used for cargo/ storage may be used if it is attached to vehicle at all times, but no construction or industrial equipment can be stored on the trailer

No internal or external alterations inconsistent
with the residential use of the building are allowed. There shall be no evidence on the exterior
of the premises or visible from the exterior of the
premises that the property is used in any way other than for a dwelling.

Only residents of the dwelling may be engaged in

work activities at the residence. Employees may not come to the residence for work purposes, including pick-up of materials, vehicles, assignments, or similar purposes.

 Prohibited home businesses include, but are not limited to: caterers, food vendors, equipment and vehicle repair shops, appliance and

small mechanical repair shops, barber and beauty shops, kennels, commercial bakeries, veterinarian clinics, funeral homes, commercial cabinetry shops, welding, trucking, adult oriented businesses, warehousing, vehicular sales, and other similar uses.




The Responsible Dog Owner

Mecklenburg County has over 218,000 dogs that produce 72,000 pounds of waste every day. As an owner of a dog, it is your responsibility to scoop the poop and keep the neighborhood poop free.

Besides being gross to step on, dog waste transmits disease, kill plants and trees.

The Lynton Board has made this messy task a little easier for you. There are now three (3) pet waste stations in the neighborhood.



Stations contain bags and a garbage can to dispose of pet waste.

Remember that it is the owner responsibility to en-

sure that their pet does not become obnoxious or offensive on account of noise, order, unsanitary conditions or other nuisance.

All pets must be kept on a leash when outside of the home.

Your persistence to keep the neighborhood clear of poop is most appreciated by your neighbors. Let's love our neighborhood just as must as we love our pets

- Station 1 is near the adult pool
- Station 2 is at the end of Lynton Blvd
- Station 3 is at the pond in Pritchard Place

8 Thrifty Garbage Disposal Cleaning Tips


Did you know that your home's garbage disposal needs to be cleaned regularly? During use, food particles and residue can be left behind and cause the unit to have an unpleasant odor. The
