Pool Pass Distribution



Spring has sprung, the days are longer and the weather is getting warmer. This is clear signs that pool season is just about to start and this means that pool passes will be

distributed soon. Here is what you need to know. Pool passes will be distributed to eligible homeowners from 6:00pm - 7:30pm on the following dates.

- Tuesday, May 21, 2019
- Wednesday, May 22, 2019
- Thursday, May 23, 2019

Homeowners who have renters occupying their home are responsible to coordinate pool passes for their renters.

Residents who fail to get a pool pass at these designated times may obtain them at the William Douglas offices located on Park Road.

Pool Season Changes

The Lynton Place Board is notifying you of some changes to the 2019 pool season.

 For your safety and pleasure, the pool hours are changing to 11:00am -8:00pm when school is out of session. While school is in session, the pool hours will be 4:00pm - 8:00pm. This new time coincides with the times the pool monitor is present and the bathrooms are available for use.

- No illegal drugs are allowed around or in the pool area
- There is no smoking or vaping while the swimmer is in the pool
- Anyone in the pool area when the pool is closed is subject to arrest and revocation of pool privileges for the remainder of the pool season.

No nuisances shall be allowed upon the condominium property and no person shall engage in any use, practice or activity upon the condominium property which is noxious, offen-
