City of Charlotte Solid Waste Services will not collect garbage, recycling, yard waste and bulky items on Monday, December 25, 2017. Solid Waste Services will operate on a one-day

delay beginning on Tuesday, December 26, 2017 with Friday customers receiving service on Saturday, December 30, 2017.

The solid waste services of the City of Charlotte will collect natural Christmas trees from the curb starting on January 2, 2018. Place the nature trees at the curb on our normal collection day. Artificial trees must be scheduled for collection by calling. Lights, ornaments and tinsel must be removed prior to placing them at the curb.

# 6 Ways to Save Energy this Winter

# 6 Ways to Save Energy this Winter continued

If you have ceiling fans in your apartment, you have more control over ventilation than you know. Ceiling fans can be used strategically to achieve better airflow: counterclockwise will push hot air up in the

summer and clockwise will trap heat inside to keep your rooms warmer during cooler months. Turn your ceiling fan on a low setting to gently push hot air back down.

# 4) Adjust the thermostat at

**night.** According to the U.S. Department of Energy, you can save

about 10 percent per year on your heating bills by turning your thermostat down 10 to 15 degrees for eight hours. Consider investing in flannel sheets and a warm comforter for your bed and keeping your apartment cooler when you sleep.

**5) Only heat the rooms you use.** If you have rooms that you never use, like guest rooms or large storage

using a space heater in the rooms where you need it and setting the thermostat to 62 degrees, you can save approximately \$200 each year.

By 6) Invest in insulation. Hundreds of thousands of dollars in energy costs are lost each year due to escaping heat and cold air in homes without proper insulation. Get some inexpensive insulation from your local home improvement store, and cover up all those areas where heat

might escape. Start with foam weather stripping for your doors and windows; it's cheap and is extremely easy to apply.

# Christmas Tree Safety Tips

Don't let Christmas ever heat up too much with fire that is. Did you know that Christmas trees alone result in 13 million dollars, annually, in property damage? More importantly, these fires present real risk towards family and friends. When showcasing a live tree in your

home, the combination of tree dryness, electrical malfunction with lights and poorly located heating sources can make for a deadly combination.

If your Christmas isn't complete without a live Christmas tree, follow these safety precautions to keep threats at bay.

- Fresh trees are less likely to catch fire, so look for a tree with vibrant green needles that are hard to pluck and don't break easily from its branches. The tree shouldn't be shedding its needles readily.
- Always place your tree away from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights, and keep the tree base

filled with water to avoid a dry out.

 Make sure all your indoor and outdoor Christmas lights have been tested in a lab by the UL or ETL/ITSNA for safety, and throw out any damaged lights.

> • Any lights you use outdoors must be labeled suitable for exterior placement, and be sure to plug them into a ground-fault circuit interrupter protected receptacle.

• Keep all your holiday candles away from your Christmas tree, surrounding furniture and décor.

• Bedtime means lights off! - Don't forget to turn your Christmas tree lights off each night.

When your tree begins to drop its needles, it's time to say goodbye to your evergreen foliage until next year. So this year, follow our guidelines to avoid being another statistic in the National Fire Protection Association or United States Fire Administration report during the upcoming holiday season.

## **Devonshire Court Covenant Review - Restrictions of Use**

- All lots shall be used for residential purposes only.
- No noxious or offensive activity shall be conducted on any lot \_\_\_\_\_\_

or in any dwelling nor shall anything be done thereon or therein which may be or become an annoyance or a nuisance to the neighborhood.

 No animals, livestock or poultry of any kind

> shall be kept or maintained on any lot or in any dwelling except dogs, cats or other household pets may be kept or maintained provided they are not kept or maintained

for commercial purposes and provided further that the number of pets does not exceed three. All dogs must be contained, tied or on leaders when within the confines of property

or on any lot.

• No drying or airing of any clothing or bedding shall be permitted outdoors on any lot or any other unenclosed area within the properties.
