Be sure your pool time is safe for everyone. Follow the signs and be safe.


Here are Some Pool Reminders:

## **Proposed Natural Gas Increase**

Did You Know?

Piedmont Natural Gas has filed an application with the NC Utilities Commission requesting a 15.3% increase in its rates & charges for natural gas in NC. This will mean that the average customer will pay \$25.92 more in the winter months (\$3.39 in the summer). Make your voice heard. #### Covenant Review - Article VIII: Use Restrictions

Section 1 - <u>Land Use</u>: All lots shall be used for residential purposes only.

Section 2 - <u>Nuisances</u>: No noxious or offensive activity shall be conducted upon any lot or in any dwelling nor shall anything be done thereon or therein which may be or may become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood.



Section 3 - <u>Animals</u>: No animals, livestock or poultry of any kind shall be kept or maintained on any lot or in any dwelling except that dogs, cats, or other household pets may be kept or maintained provided they are not kept or maintained for commercial purposes and provided further that the number of pets does not exceed three. All dogs must be kept contained, tied or on leaders when within the properties or on any lot.





Section 4 - <u>Clothes drying</u>: No drying of airing of any clothing or bedding shall be permitted outdoors on any lot or any other unenclosed area within the properties, except in such areas within the properties or on lots which are approved for such purposes by the Board of Directors.



#### Summer Home Maintenance Checklist

Summer is an ideal time to tackle those little repairs and maintenance issues you've been putting off. Indoor maintenance tasks often focus on keeping your house cool by preparing your cooling system for summer temperatures.

- Changing HVAC filters
- Testing the AC
- Washing the insides of windows
- Adding UV protective or thermal window treatments to reduce heat transfer
- Reversing the direction of your ceiling fans
- Deep cleaning your garbage disposal, dishwasher, washing machine, dryer and other appliances
- Checking appliance hoses for leaks
- Testing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and change the batteries
- Vacuuming your vents
- Deep cleaning all surfaces

Exterior maintenance usually takes a little more work in the summer. It's a good time to freshen up your home's exterior with tasks like staining your deck.

- Cleaning your gutters
- Inspecting your roof for missing or damaged shingles
- Power-washing siding, sidewalks, decks and other surfaces
- Painting or staining worn surfaces
- Cleaning your exterior air conditioning unit
- Trimming bushes and trees
- Cleaning and setting up outdoor furniture
- Inspecting fences for damage
- Looking for cracks, rotting and other damage on siding
- Caulking around windows and filling in other cracks and gaps
- Cleaning your exterior dryer vent
- Cleaning and prepping your grill

# Home Safety

Keeping your home safe keeps our community safe. Simple steps can boost your home's security.

- Make sure your house is well lit
- Use exterior doors that are steel or solid core
- Use deadbolt locks with 1" throw to secure exterior doors.
- Secure sliding glass doors by installing a pin through the frame, a locking device or a broomstick in the tracks
- Secure windows with locks or pins for both closed and partially opened positions
- Do not leave a spare key hidden outside your home or in your vehicle
- Trim trees and shrubbery to keep them from providing access points to upper floors and creating blind spots. Landscaping should not create hiding places or block windows and doors.
- Remove items an intruder could use to gain access to your home. (e.g., ladders, tables, chairs, lawn tools, children's toys)
- Always keep your garage door closed, even while home or doing yard activities.
- Place items of greater value further back into the garage area instead of close to the door.
